fisheries. So how do you rate? Take the Stewardship Quiz and get your score!

ON THE WATER

Check the box if the statement is true for you. When keeping fish, I harvest selectively from fast-reproducing species. I tend to release most or all of the large, predatory fish I catch (bass, musky, etc.). I always release really big fish to keep trophy genetics in the gene pool. I release 100% of the wild (non-hatchery) salmon, trout and steelhead I catch. I fish lead-free (split shot, worm weights, jigs, bottom bouncers, etc.). I fish single barbless hooks pretty much all the time, and if using trebles, I pinch the barbs. When fishing with live or dead bait, I use circle hooks or quick-strike rigs. I carry out a bag of someone else's trash every time I go fishing on public water. I always wash boots, waders and boat after being in a waterway with invasive species. I never leave fishing line behind, and I clean up any that I find...and 6-pack holders, too! I never, ever dump unused minnows or other bait into the lake or river. I wouldn't think of transporting live fish from one public waterway to another. I will introduce someone new to fishing this year, or have in the past year. Bears may poop in the woods or waters, but I do not. I find or create an appropriate latrine. I keep fish out of the water for under 1 minute if I plan to release them. Add 'em up! This is your "on the water" score.

Off the water

Check the box if the statement is true for you. I have a low-flow shower head in my house. I use phosphate-free, biodegradable dish soap, laundry detergent and cleaners. I wash my car in the car wash instead of in the driveway. I have CFL light bulbs in my house. I have a water heater blanket on my water I turn lights off when I'm not in a room. I never put used motor oil or antifreeze down the drain, storm drain, or behind the garage. Yes! We recycle at my house! Paper, plastic, metal and glass. I never fertilize, or if I do, I do so sparingly with organic or safer-alternative fertilizers. I clean up after my dog, in the yard and on walks (mark this if you don't have a dog, too). I have written a government official regarding a conservation issue in the past year. I give at least \$100 to stewardship causes every year, and/or volunteer regularly. I use a re-usable coffee cup and water bottle. I "go vegetarian" one day a week (or more). I borrow, repair and re-use rather than buy more "stuff" as much as is possible. Add 'em up!
